No prior AIDC experience is assumed at entry. Certified AIDC Professional asks only for basic digital literacy.

The gap between the floor and the system

Most organisations have people who understand physical operations, and people who understand enterprise software. Very few have people who are fluent in both - and that gap is where AIDC projects fail.

DATA	Systems disagree because capture is manual, late or unverified	Data describes what actually happened, at the moment it happened
DEPLOYMENT	Equipment is bought, then quietly underused or misconfigured	Devices are commissioned, documented and supportable from day one
FAILURE	Nobody can tell whether the tag, the device, the network or the app is at fault	Faults are isolated methodically across every boundary

No award at any level can be earned by multiple-choice testing alone. Every level requires authentic artefacts, documentation and demonstrated recovery from failure - not only a working demonstration.

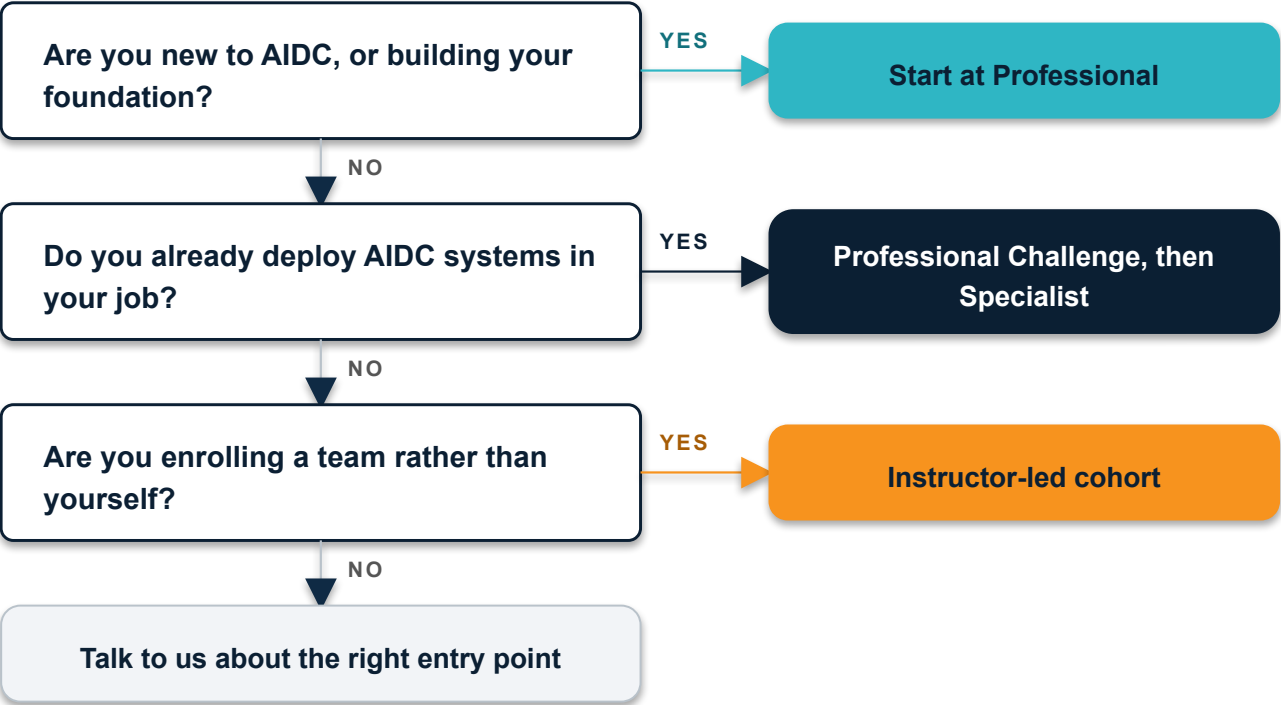

One certification. Three ways to prepare. Every route ends at exactly the same independently assessed credential - the route you take is never printed on it.

An assessed core, and the enrichment around it

	CORE Assessed · controlled release	ENRICHMENT Optional · living release
WHAT IT IS	The modules the credential is built on	Optional modules that ship with the credential
ASSESSED	Yes. Every core module is examinable, and the award rests on it	No. Enrichment is never examined and never gates your credential
WHAT IT COSTS	Included in the rate	Also included. There is no separate fee and nothing further to buy
HOW IT CHANGES	Through controlled release, so an award boundary is never moved casually	Through living release, so it can move at the pace the technology actually does

Every level carries optional enrichment alongside its assessed core.

- Professional** An introduction to AI in AIDC - what it is doing in this field, where it already works, and where it does not.
- Specialist** Integrating AI into AIDC workflows, and integrating mission-critical communications.
- Expert** Governing AI in AIDC, and governing mission-critical communications.

This is why the AI conversation runs through the whole ladder rather than sitting in one module: you meet it as an introduction, then as an integration problem, then as a governance responsibility.

Depth in a sector, on top of the ladder



A badge carries its own ID

Issued from the register and checkable by anyone, with no account.

Vertical depth, without creating a fourth level. A badge says you can do this work in a named sector - under its regulation, its workflows and its data.

- It opens after Specialist**
Professional and Specialist, both valid and both yours. An Expert holder can name that award on the badge as well, and completes an assurance-level extension where it applies.
- It is not a higher tier**
A badge adds sector fluency across the ladder you already hold. The framework is explicit that badges do not create a Level 4 and must never weaken the role boundary of your main certification.
- It is earned, not bought**
An industry case or project, a sector assessment and assessor sign-off - assessed against current regulation, workflow, stakeholder and data requirements.
- It is verifiable**
Each badge carries its own ID, issued from the register and resolvable by anyone, with no account.
- It stays current**
Reviewed or renewed every two years at \$149, and sooner after a material regulatory change. Sector regulation moves faster than the framework around it.
